Newsletter Update

Due to a lack of registrants, the DIBI Committee has cancelled the DIBI 2024 conference slated for March 13, 2024. As a result of this decision all

speakers and the venue have been notified. Promotion on all web-based platforms has been cancelled also.

The committee feels it has a good footing for the next DIBI event as all speakers when contacted were very supportive of the rationale behind cancelling the conference and each stated a desire to participate at our next DIBI event.

DIBI Leads with the June Steeve-Lendrum Family Resource Centre, and the CAS for DIBI, were completely understanding of the need to cancel out of respect for the time and effort that speakers make to prepare and deliver their presentations. Both stated that they will look forward to another opportunity to work Soroptimists in the future.

The decision to cancel was not taken lightly. The committee held deep discussions to assess the situation and alternative actions were weighed. All agreed that a pivot to a school-based model for 2024-25 would be best.

In the next month a connection will be made with local school boards to ascertain their interest in having DIBI in their schools. The committee is now looking to a delivery date in the Fall of 2024, if such is convenient for the school selected.

Before the required reporting dates, discussion will be held with the Soroptimist Foundation of Canada and the Soroptimist International of the Americas to determine how the grants we received will be affected by the cancellation of the conference.

The committee thanks all club membership for the help and support that each has given to us.

Girls Transitioning to Adulthood


Below is the list of supplies needed in the CAS cupboard.



Loblaws, Shoppers Drug Mart and other Toronto stores roll out safety campaign using a code word

In Toronto, October 24, 2023 - Victim Services Toronto (VST) announced its ground-breaking partnership with Canada's grocery retailer, Loblaw Companies Ltd ("Loblaw") to launch a transformative program to enhance the safety and well-being of the Toronto community. This initiative marked the local adaptation of the highly successful *Ask for Angela* campaign, originally established in the United Kingdom in 2016.

The Ask for Angela campaign assists individuals who feel unsafe, vulnerable, or threatened at bars, clubs, and various other venues. This program aims to ensuring the safety and protection of patrons across the city.

By working together, the two organizations foster a safer and more inclusive community where everyone feels protected and supported. This partnership represents a powerful collaboration between a respected community service organization and a renowned retailer, highlighting their shared commitment to community well-being

A concise and user-friendly online training tool accessible to the staff of participating stores has been developed.

Participating stores include Loblaw, Real Canadian Superstore, Shoppers Drug Mart, No Frills, Valu-Mart and Your Independent Grocers.

I wanted to bring this story to the attention of members of the club for consideration of implementing the program in Thunder Bay.

In Ottawa, June 2017, a bar posted a notice in their washrooms and at the door of their business, Hi I'm Angela. The owner stated that after learning that one of their clients had a negative experience on a particularly busy night at the bar that it was important to left someone know. He heard about the Ask Angela program in the UK and instituted the program in his bar.

The idea he said is simple: If a patron's Tinder date is going sour or they're feeling harassed, he or she can go to the bar and ask for Angela, prompting trained staff to step in and discreetly deal with the situation. Once our staff hears that, they can offer assistance, escort you out of the property, call a taxi, or find a safe space for you in the bar.

Why the Soroptimist "Dream It Be It" Program is Important

At this year's Grammy Awards, I heard a song by Tracy Chapman that was titled "Fast Cars". It was written over thirty-five years ago (1988). (This is an abbreviated version of the lyrics — the ones that resonate with me.) I wonder how many girls continue to make the choice to hitch their stars to a "fellow with a fast car" — some fellow who they think will improve their lot in life.

The song starts with:

"You got a fast car I want a ticket to anywhere Maybe we make a deal Maybe together we can get somewhere Any place is better..."

The lyrics speak of a young woman with a plan who has saved a bit of money working at the convenience store.

"I got a plan to get us out of here I been working at the convenience store Managed to save just a little bit of money Won't have to drive too far...
You and I can both get jobs
And finally see what it means to be living.."

We learn that her mother has left the family. The young girl has quit high school to take care of her alcoholic father.

"See, my old man's got a problem
He lives with the bottle, that's the way it is
He says his body's too old for working...
My mama went off and left him...
I said, somebody's got to take care of him
So I quit school and that's what I did"

As you likely predicated life is not kind to the girl in the song, but she is still optimistic. "You still ain't got a job
And I work in a market as a checkout girl
I know things will get better
You'll find work and I'll get promoted
We'll move out of the shelter
Buy a bigger house and live in the suburbs"

As the song continues, we learn that the "fellow with the fast car" is like her dad – the cycle continues.

"You got a fast car
I got a job that pays all our bills
You stay out drinking late at the bar
See more of your friends than you do of your kids
I'd always hoped for better
Thought maybe together you and me would find it
I got no plans, I ain't going nowhere
So take your fast car and keep on driving..."

"You got a fast car Is it fast enough so you can fly away? You gotta make a decision Leave tonight or live and die this way"

I can only hope that our Soroptimist "Dream It, Be It" programs carried out in communities around the world will influence girls to "hitch their star" to themselves and get an education in order to improve their lot in life. Fingers crossed!
